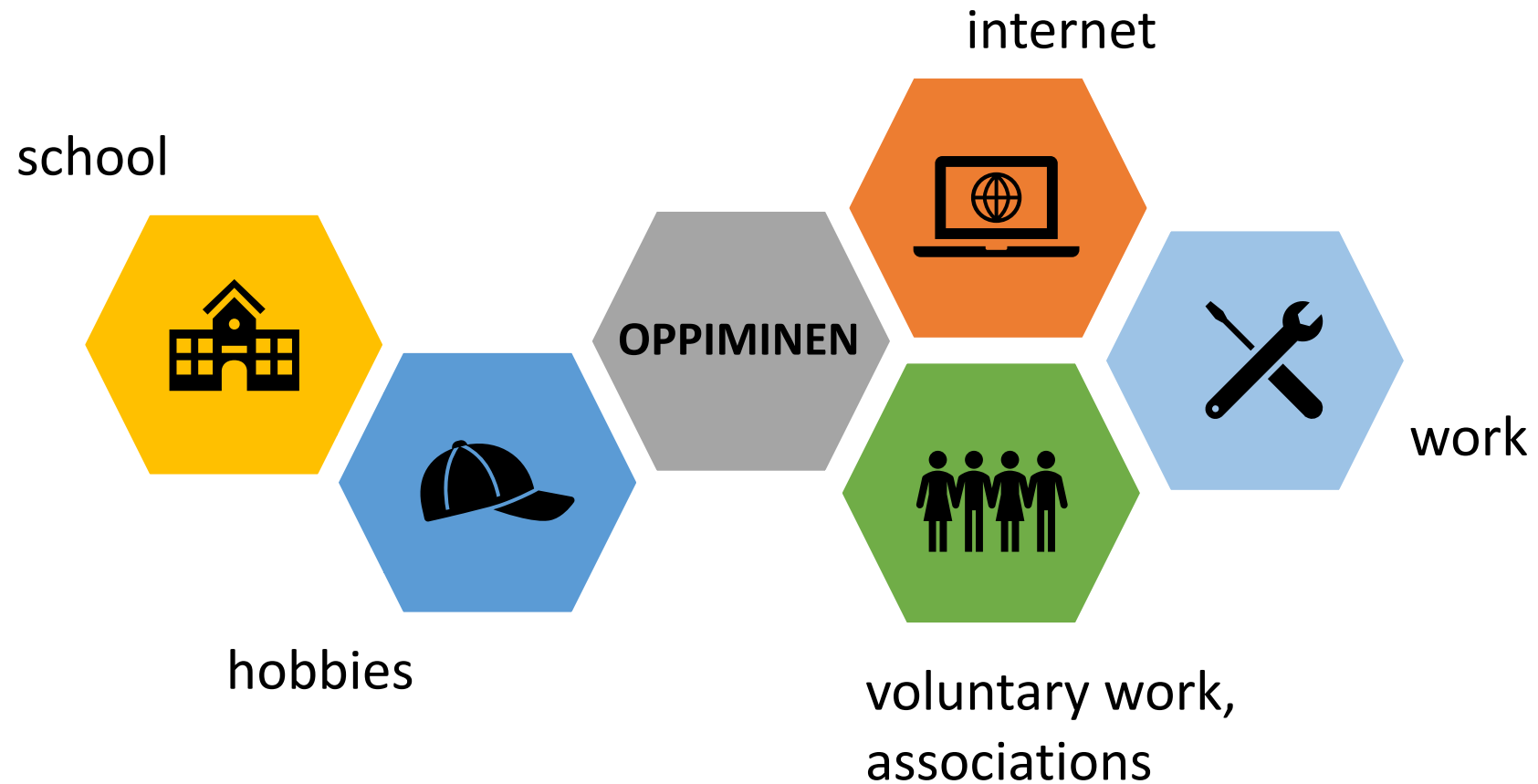

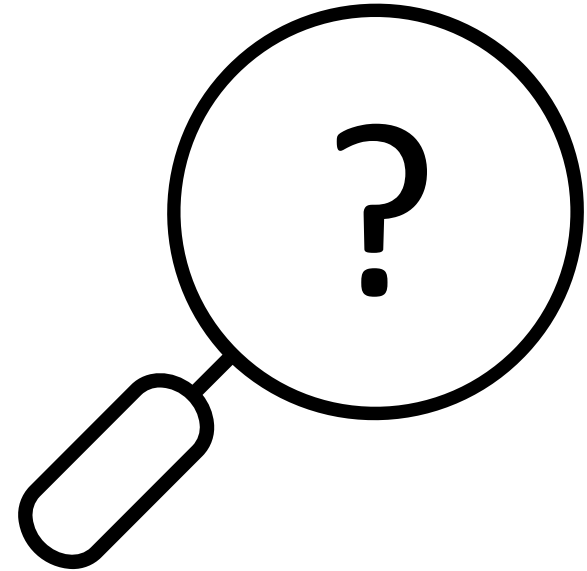

Learning happens in various contexts



Does competence show?

- All competences are not visible on school certificates
- Often, skills remain hidden
- Open badges help in making skills visible



What is an open badge?

- A digital badge used on the internet, which can be awarded for skills, achievements, or participation, for example
- Open badges are already used in many countries



What does an open badge contain?

- A badge is an image that includes a lot of information, such as:
 - badge name
 - badge description
 - competence criteria
 - date of issue
 - issuer information



SECURE ACTION

The recipient of this badge is able to act safely in digital environments.

#antivirus, #CompetitiveSkills, #cybersecurity, #malware, #privacy, #security

The recipient of the badge can

- identify the most common cyber threats and information security threats
- protect their devices (e.g., antivirus software, device locking and blocking malware)
- recognise when their information security has been violated and act accordingly

Demonstration of competence

The recipient of this badge demonstrated their competence in a separate application form.

A digital open badge is a standardised proof of competence.

Nationwide open badge constellation

The nationwide open badge constellation has been developed in the Competitive Skills project (Osuvat Taidot, from 2019 to 2021) funded by the European Social Fund.

How can badges be used?

- To showcase one's own skills more effectively
- To show and express skills in studies or job applications, for instance
- One can create suitable combinations of badges for different situations
- Badges can be shared
 - on social media across different platforms
 - added as links to a resume or job application
 - in PDF format

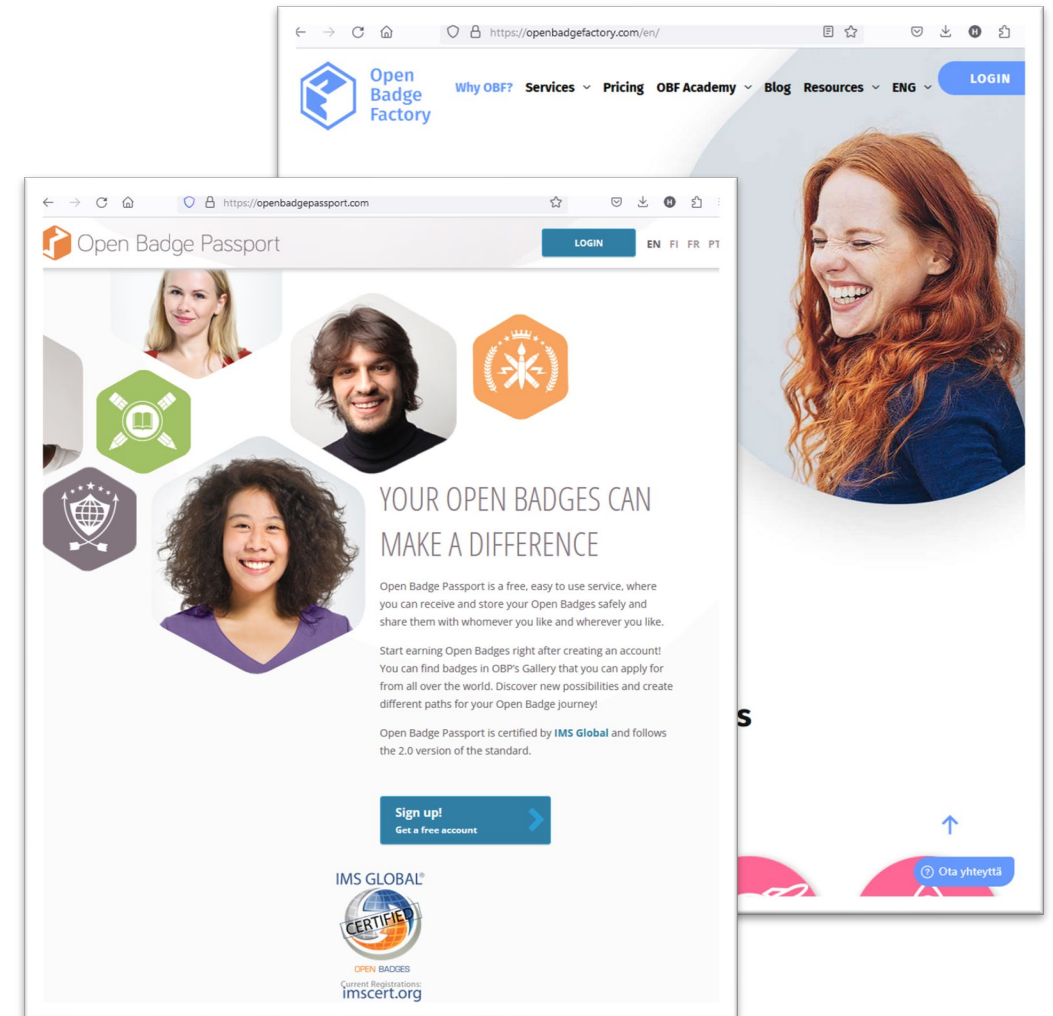

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In practice

- The recipient gathers the badges into a specially designed service, so called passport.
- These services are free of charge.
- The badge issuers has own software, so called factory – usually subject to a charge.
- Several competence badge software options are available, including:
 - Badgr (ex. Mozilla Backpack)
 - BadgeCraft and Badge Wallet
 - BadgeOS
 - Credly
 - Open Badge Factory and Open Badge Passport
 - all support the Open Badge standard
